

## Network Proposes New Name - Feedback Welcome



Our Network has engaged in branding discovery work to help develop a Network logo and a new name. Feedback received included: **Keep it Simple & Direct** - The current name is far too long and does not define what services it offers to women & children – Health-related services. The name needs to be concise and not abstract as the Network does not have the resources (financially or human) to educate and build a brand that requires a lot of explaining.

## Suggested Strategic/Creative Brand Direction

**Option 1** Main Name: Women & Children's Health Network, Qualifier > North Central Ontario — Straightforward, easy to understand and clearly defines who the Network is intended for and its main benefit – Health. The primary identity will use the Main Name and the geographical qualifier will be a secondary element to define the areas served.

**Option 2** Alternate Name: Women & Children's Health Collective, Qualifier > North Central Ontario - Similar to the above but the word 'Network' is replaced with 'Collective' for a more contemporary, slightly abstract approach that provides more of a community feel. However, the true interpretation of a 'network' becomes a little less defined.

What is NRP PLUS? The PLUS component of this course was developed to focus exclusively on the post-resuscitation/pretransport stabilization care of sick infants. The curriculum was created specifically with level 1 partners in mind.

In this component, the focus is on common post resuscitative complications that can and do occur with the goal to educate and assist the health care providers taking care of these fragile infants with information and strategies to improve the high level of care these infants require.
