Are you ready to deliver culturally appropriate pregnancy care? Introducing: The Indigenous Culturally Appropriate (CAPC) Training. A 6-week course designed to help you transition from feeling unclear about delivering culturally appropriate pregnancy care to feeling confident in your cultural knowledge and abilities to continue fostering positive and engaging relationships with prenatal

and postpartum Indigenous people and their families.

Coordinated by The Biidaaban Doula Collective, meaning "Sunrise" in Anishinaabemowin – is made up of a group of Indigenous doulas who work with midwives and doctors to provide full-circle informational, emotional, physical, and spiritual support to Indigenous people and their families during their pregnancy, birth, and postpartum journeys. They also provide support around reproductive health experiences including, fertility, abortion, perinatal loss, and adoption. See attachment for registration information.
